### Research ideas: information and checklist

We are very pleased to say that there seems to be an increase in the number of osteopaths interested in research. We are frequently contacted by osteopaths who would like to develop an idea for a research project, collaborate with others or share their clinical experiences with the profession and the public.



We have developed a research idea information sheet and checklist to guide you through the various elements of basic research design so that when you come to sharing your idea with others you can have more confidence in your explanation. A well thought out research proposal makes it easier for interested parties to give you advice and help you develop the idea further and it is essential when applying for funding.

The key areas covered in the information sheet are:

 Defining your research question and why it is important

### Think PICO:

**P**opulation: Describe your population of interest. **I**ntervention: What is the treatment you want to research?

Comparator group: What can you compare your intervention/treatment with?

Outcomes: How are you going to measure effects

or outcomes?

# The first research symposium at the British School of Osteopathy

On 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2013, The British School of Osteopathy hosted its inaugural, multidisciplinary research symposium for manual therapy and musculoskeletal (MSK) medicine. Steven Vogel, Vice Principal of the BSO, and Dr Oliver Thomson, Research Officer at the BSO, convened the symposium to explore current issues that are impacting on education and practice in manual therapy and musculoskeletal healthcare. The aim was to provide a forum to disseminate and discuss current research activity and to provide an opportunity to identify key research questions and collaboration possibilities. The key themes of the day were: clinical expertise, reasoning and decision-making, with talks from Dr Nicola Petty, Dr Oliver Thomson, and Professor Stephen Tyreman and patient-centered care and self-reported outcomes with Dr Mary Sexton, Danijela Serbic, Dr Jorge Esteves, and Jonathan Field. The day concluded with a group discussion about future symposia, and ideas for future collaboration and research; the overall consensus being that a collaborative approach to research in manual therapy and MSK medicine would be incredibly valuable to both practitioners and patients.
